Black Christian History

The Bible is the world's most read history book!! It records the Creation of the Universe as well as of the human family. It chronicles the bloodline and the lineage of those begotten of Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham, Moses and many others onto the genealogy of Jesus; with emphasis on the Jewish\Israelite traditions. With this being the case, surely the recognition of history, culture and the human family tree experience is of importance in God's World, if not there would not be as much mentioning of it all throughout the Bible and other Holy Books. The questions then become, should history be important to Christians these days, and how does looking back help us move forward as Believers??

February is designated in America as Black History month. It was created by Dr. Carter G. Woodson in 1926 as a way to remind the world of the accomplishments, inventions and contributions of Black People in America, and is recognized by people of all races. Notwithstanding, there are many Black Christians who believe that their history nor their Blackness has anything to do with their faith, and for that matter, the God Who fashioned them so.

Once again, the Holy Bible records the histories of the Egyptians, the Hamites, the Canaanites, Hebrews, Samaritans, Philippians, Romans and of course the Children of the Nation of Israel, who are distinguished by individual tribes, each of which had their own culture, covenants and encounters documenting their Love and reverence for God. If God Almighty Fashioner of all allows these legacies and heritages to flourish in His Scriptures about people from the ancient past in faraway lands, what about those from the recent past in this nation??

Did you know that Black Christians strongly helped to build the powerful infrastructure for American Christianity to be what it is today? Black Christians have established churches all across America for every denomination, from the Baptist, the Methodist, the Church of Christ to the Unitarians, Lutherans, and Presbyterians on to the Pentecostals for the most part on their own. The eldest known surviving church to be built solely to serve Black Christians was called the African Meeting House, built in 1806, during slavery, in Boston, and is still standing today.

Richard Allen was the first ordained Black Bishop and the founder of the AME (African Methodist Episcopal) churches in 1815, and before that he compiled the first Black Spiritual Hymnal in 1801. In 1817, Elder Jarena Lee was the first allowed Black woman preacher and evangelist on these shores. And, when White folk in Savannah, Georgia would not allow Black worshippers to enter their churches, Minister Andrew Bryan erected the First African Baptist Church to serve God's Purpose. Professor Deborah Wolfe was the first Black Woman President of the Clergy Council of New Jersey; these are only a small portion of the contributors to the advancement of Christianity in America.

Black Christian History *Cont'd*

Finally, but not nearly the final, we should not forget ordained Pastor Nat Turner, who in 1831 used the Guidance and the Spirit of God to help with the overthrowing of the most devilish hell any people have suffered in any history, which would be American chattel slavery (1831-1831).

Truly we must always remember that the largest champion in the struggle for liberation, civil rights, human equality and an end to racial bigotry, also the founder of the Southern CHRISTIAN Leadership Conference (SCLC) which pathed the ways for God-trusting people to embrace the dream of living with justice and in harmony was, REVEREND Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., a very strong Black Christian.

To answer the question should history be important to Christians, of course the answer is yes, if not how would we know who Jesus is, where he came from, what the experiences were that shaped him to be who he was and what his message was without looking to the past?? Surely the Resurrection of Christ would lose some of its flavor without knowing the significance of his birth, his baptism and the crucifixion, right??

In order for a single person, a group or a nation of people to know where they are going (hopefully Heaven Bound), they must have a beginning to know the direction in which they should move in to get there. Knowing the history of your faith is the only way by which you can gage your progress as a Believer, this is why we each have and give our testimonies, as it tells what God has brought us through to get to where we are. What would be the Blessing of making it to the Promised Land without knowing about the forty years of wandering; history is very important.

In conclusion, the Black Christian has a very enormously rich heritage, from the Nubian (African) that Phillip the Deacon converted in 35 A.D. in Acts 8:26-40, up to the Founder of Growth Ministries Lonnie Johnson, we have done a good and faithful job in the service of God and humanity. God does not Create anything that does not fulfill His Divine Purpose and Plan. Stories of Ex-Convicts Who Turned Their Lives Around

Each month we will try to share with you a case of an individual who has been released from prison and went on to make a positive impact on society.

The Millionaire Ex-Convict



Uchendi Nwani lived a very Jekyll/Hyde existence during his college years. On the surface, Nwani—raised by his stepfather, who was a pastor in one of Nashville’s largest Baptist congregations—played the role of exemplary student to his family and friends. However, Nwani hid a very dark secret underneath that shining exterior: He was a drug dealer, and a very notorious one at that. His greed got the better of him on October 15, 1993, when police caught a million-dollar shipment of cocaine while he was in the middle of an exam during his senior year.

He later turned himself in and did six and a half months of hard labor at a federal boot camp before he returned to finish his studies. To make ends meet, he cut hair at the university salon while living in a halfway house. After he graduated, he opened his own barber shop and school which later became a huge success. Nwani now travels around the country to show that he is living proof that, no matter how low you sink, you really can turn your life around if you don’t give up.


Three Hymns
