EX-CONS WHO TURNED THEIR LIVES AROUND

Reginald Dwayne Betts

As a teen, Betts and a friend of his stumbled across a man sleeping in a car in the parking lot of Springfield Mall, Virginia. The pair of boys held the man at gunpoint and stole his car, keeping the man prisoner as they went on a ride.

It was a very costly ride, and in less than a day Betts was caught and charged with six felonies. He was later tried as an adult and served a sentence of nine years. Apparently the judge who handed down the sentence actually believed such a stunt would offer the young Betts a chance at redemption, getting him off the streets and into an environment where he could spend his time learning something.

Ironically, it sort of worked and Betts wrote "A Question of Freedom: A Memoir of Learning, Survival, and Coming of Age in Prison". Per the story, prison was essentially a place of "ritualized humiliation, not rehabilitation," but from it Betts was able to find his redemption via the book itself. Turned out he had a knack for writing, and now, along with being a popular published author, he's also a poetry teacher at the University of Maryland and a fellow at the Open Society Institute.



Each year many people pledge to be healthier as their New Year's resolution. Few succeed. Failure is usually the result of a lack of discipline. Growth Ministries challenges you to commit to a healthy spiritual life. Having a healthy spiritual life is similar to having a healthy physical life. You need to have a good **diet, exercise** and get adequate **rest**.

Excerpts from a sermon by Pastor David Frech on 1/6/19 at Church of the Harvest as heard by Lonnie Johnson

Adam BY PASTOR MIKE HERNANDEZ, CHURCH OF THE HARVEST

Happy New Year to you! Over the next 12 months, I am going to focus on a man from the Bible and share thoughts about him. Some of these thoughts will be things he did well. Some of these thoughts will be things he did not do so well. I take encouragement that the Bible is filled with people who had flaws and wasn't perfect. I find myself in that category more often than I would like to admit.

We will start this journey with taking a look at the first man, Adam.

Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth." - Genesis 1:26-28

According to these verses, God created man for several reasons: to be a reflection of God (man was created in His image), to have dominion, to be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it. These purposes still exist today and are for every man (if any women are reading this, these verses apply to you to but for the context of this study, I am going to focus on communicating to men).

Then the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, saying "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die." - Genesis 2:15-17

Notice that God gave Adam complete freedom, with one exception - he was not to eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. Pretty much everything else was acceptable. Adam lived in a perfect relationship with God and had just one rule to follow. Now it is interesting to note that God put the Tree of the Knowledge of Good & Evil right in the middle of the garden. He did not hide it where it would be difficult for Adam to obtain the fruit. Instead, God put the tree where Adam would be constantly around it. I believe this is because God wanted Adam to choose to obey Him every day. I believe this is still what God wants, for us to choose Him every day.

The command to not eat of the fruit of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good & Evil was given to Adam. Eve was not yet created and we have no record that God gave this command to Eve. It was Adams's responsibility to pass the decree from God down to his family.

And the Lord God said, "It is not good that man should be alone; I will make him a helper comparable to him". - Genesis 2:18

The word "helper" is the word "ezer" in the original Hebrew language and literally means "aid, help". The word does not denote that a woman is inferior to man, but instead is to be his helper, as man is in need of help. Men and women are co-equal in God's sight. In fact, the word "ezer" is used 21 times in the Old Testament and 16 times the word "ezer" is used to describe the Lord as our "helper".

I will lift up my eyes to the hills, from whence comes my help (ezer)? My help (ezer) comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. - Psalms 121:1-2

When the serpent comes to tempt Eve, Adam was right there.

Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said to the woman, "Has God indeed said, 'you shall not eat of every tree of the garden'?" And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden but of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden God has said, 'you shall not eat it, nor touch it, lest you die'. "Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."– Genesis 2:1-5

This is where Adam failed in his responsibilities. Adam should have stepped in and protected his wife. The command from God was given to him directly and the serpent just said the exact opposite of what God said. God said they would die if they ate the fruit, the serpent said they would be like God if they ate the fruit. Instead of Adam being proactive and telling the serpent to leave, he was passive and watched his wife get tricked by the serpent and then ultimately ate the fruit himself.

Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings. And they heard the sound of the Lord walking in the garden in the cool of the day; and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. – Genesis 3:7-8

The consequence of Adam's disobedience was sin entered the world. Adam and Eve realized they were naked and tried to cover themselves with fig leaves. And isn't that what we do when we have sin in our lives? We try to cover ourselves.

Then when God came looking for them, Adam and Eve hid. And isn't that what we do when God comes looking for us...we try to hide from Him?

And finally, when God confronted Adam about his sin, Adam made excuses.

And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you that you should not eat?" Then the man said, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree and I ate." – Genesis 3:11-12

And isn't that what us men do when we are confronted with our sin, we cover ourselves, hide from God and take no responsibility for our actions.

Adam and Eve had consequences for their sin. They had to leave the garden and work for food. We always have consequences for our sin. But I take hope with what God does next for Adam and Eve.

Also, for Adam and his wife, the Lord God made tunics of skin, and clothed them. – Genesis 3:21

In God's mercy and compassion, God covered Adam and Eve when they couldn't cover themselves. He does the same for us. He covers us when we can't cover ourselves. I am so thankful that He covers us! I know there are so many times when I don't deserve His covering, but He still covers; that I don't deserve His forgiveness, but He still forgives. You can receive His forgiveness too!

I Hate Liars!
