Merry Christmas!



James the Less





For the past 11 months we have been examining the life of the 12 disciples of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We started with Peter, then James the son of Zebedee, John, James's brother, Andrew, Judas Iscariot the betrayer of Jesus, Philip, Bartholomew, Thaddaeus, Matthew also known as Levi, Thomas also known by the misnomer "doubting Thomas", Simon the Zealot, and now, last but certainly not least James, son of Alphaeus or James" the less".

James, son of Alphaeus, was one of Jesus' twelve apostles and one of three people named James mentioned in the New Testament. Other than being listed as a disciple, very, very little is known about James the son of Alphaeus. He is singled out from the other Jameses in the Bible by his father's name. In Bible times, men were often identified by their fathers and grandfathers. James son of Alphaeus, is also called "James the Less". The word less should be understood to mean "little" or "younger," not short or small or insignificant.

Mark 2:14 has an interesting fact that some connect with James son of Alphaeus. When Jesus calls Matthew (Levi) to follow Him, Levi is described as "the son of Alphaeus." Some Bible scholars think this means that Matthew and James were brothers. But this is doubtful, because Scripture in other places clearly identifies two sets of brothers who followed Jesus: Peter and Andrew, and James and John. No such connection was ever made between Matthew and James.

Tradition implies that it was James "the Less" who may have taken the gospel to Persia (modern Iran) and was martyred there. But other than that possibility, James the son of Alphaeus is the perfect example of humble, unknown service.

The basic lack of information about James the son of Alphaeus is a message in and of itself. This man James son of Alphaeus, James "the Less" was just as much an apostle as were Peter, James the son Zebedee and John. He will sit on a throne in Jesus' earthly kingdom with as much authority and honor as the other disciples and his name will be engraved in the foundation of the walls of the New Jerusalem (Revelation 21:14). James will not be considered "less" in eternity because he was faithful, committed, and true to his calling while on earth!

Tradition says that James, son of Alphaeus, evangelized in Persia which is modern-day Iran and was martyred there. According to Flavius Josephus, the Jewish historian, James the son of Alphaeus, was stoned to death in 62 A.D. But according to Hegesippus the Nazarene, who was a Christian writer of the early Church, James son of Alphaeus, was cast from the pinnacle of the Temple in 66 A.D., and when the fall did not kill him, he was clubbed to death.

The man, James the son of Alphaeus, should be a great encouragement to those called to live a life in obscurity. Our calling is just as sure, just as God-honoring, God-exalting, and God- glorifying, but few of us will be known by anyone other than those personal relationships which we form as we serve the Lord. Some will work their entire lives, some in remote places in the world with little or no recognition on this earth to show for it. But Our Lord God perceives, discerns and sees all. James the son of Alphaeus reminds us that Jesus understood what character meant when He chose the 12. He chose men with faithfulness, endurance, obedience, passion, courage, boldness and sacrifice. Our only responsibility is obedience to our Lord, not the outcome of our obedience. Some apostles wrote great and wonderful portions of the Bible and some had major parts and responsibilities in the gospels, but it appears that James the son of Alphaeus was quietly and humbly faithful to the Lord Jesus Christ. For that, he will be equally honored with all the other disciples for all eternity.

When God is Silent

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! I pray that you will be able to enjoy this holiday season where we celebrate Jesus' birth! Jesus coming to earth as a man, being born of a virgin is perhaps the greatest miracle ever!

This month I want to discuss a topic that we probably have all encountered. Have you ever felt that God was silent? Perhaps you felt that God has forgotten you? Have you ever thought that God gave you a promise that hasn't come true yet. What is actually happening when God is silent?

This is probably how the Israelites were feeling at the time of Jesus' birth. The last book of the Old Testament is Malachi and it was written around 430 BC. For the next 400 years, the Israelites were waiting for their Messiah, but God was silent. To them, it probably felt like they were forgotten. They were under the iron fist of Rome and God hadn't spoken through a prophet for 400 years. To them, God wasn't doing anything.

How many times in our lives de we feel like that? We feel forgotten. We feel like God is silent. We feel like God isn't moving. We feel like God isn't doing anything?

How do you think Abraham felt when he received a promise at 75 and God didn't fulfill that promise for 25 years? Do you think Abraham ever felt forgotten? Or how about Joseph (from the Old Testament)? Do you think he ever felt that way? He was given dreams from God, then sold as a slave then thrown into prison for being righteous. Do you think he felt forgotten? What about David? How do you think he felt after being anointed king, then running for his life, hiding in caves and living like a vagabond? Did he feel forgotten?

We have so many examples of people feeling forgotten. But here is the truth – God's timing is perfect and He is always working behind the scenes; we just can't see it.

So what happened in the world during the silent years? Remember, Malachi was written in 430 BC. In 331 BC, Alexander the Great goes on his world domination campaign. As Greece grows, so does the Greek language. Greek becomes the language of commerce and for the first time, a common language is established in the middle eastern area. Sometime around 132 BC the Old Testament was translated into Greek – it's called the Septuagint. Now the Old Testament can be read by more than those that only spoke Hebrew. Greek also had philosophers (Socrates, Aristotle, Plato) that brought in a new way of thinking – asking questions.

In 63 BC, Rome conquers Greece and they rule till 135 AD. Rome keeps Greek as the common language, but they introduce something very important – roads. Rome ruled with an iron fist and suppressed uprisings and crime. Thus, they were able to establish roads for trade & commerce.

And so the world Jesus was born into has a common language, the Old Testament translated into this language, a philosophy of questioning and roads to travel upon. Even though we call these the 400 silent years, God was working. The world was ready for the gospel.

We may think God isn't working but God is always working. Think about Joseph, the earthly father of Jesus. He, and his wife, Mary, stay in Bethlehem after the birth of Jesus. Based on the fact that Herod killed all the babies 2 years old and under (Matthew 2:16), we can deduce that Joseph & Mary were in Bethlehem for up to two years after Jesus' birth. God knew that Herod was going to try to kill Jesus, so he told Joseph to flee to Egypt.

How would a carpenter have enough money to take his family to Egypt? Again, God was working behind the scenes. Unbeknownst to Joseph, God showed a star to some Magi (wise men) in the east and these Magi were looking for a star that would signify the King of the Jews. When they saw the star, they went on a several hundred mile journey with the purpose of worshipping the new born king. When the Magi arrived, they found baby Jesus and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrhh (Matthew 2:1-11). Now, Joseph had money to take his family to Egypt.

Even when we believe God is silent, God is still working behind the scenes. Just like Joseph couldn't see God working on his behalf, perhaps you can't see it either. Maybe you are praying for provision for your family...God is working behind the scenes. Maybe you are praying for positive relationships, God is working on your behalf. Maybe you are praying for a Bible...if that is the case, write this ministry and they will get you a Bible right away.

Even if you believe God is silent, I promise you, He is still working on your behalf! I remember hearing a preacher once say that a teacher doesn't give answers in the middle of a test. Perhaps God is being silent because you are being tested. However, after the test, you will either hear from God or see Him move in your life.

I hope during this Christmas season you are filled with hope and peace. I pray that you are able to rejoice in the birth of Jesus, the greatest event in the history of the world. I hope that you will be encouraged to recognize that God may be silent, but He is working on your behalf. Remember, you are not forgotten! God is working for you behind the scenes, even if you can't see it!

Because often times some of those inmates that you have had family ties with or a personal connection to, you want to keep in touch with and when the opportunity comes, and these seasons arrive again, even if you are on the other side of the fence, you still feel some kind of way. Like the term, "you're not the only one locked up because your family is doing the time with you." In other words, they need strength and uplifting too.

I've once said, or even twice said, in these newsletters, that the book doesn't end once you get released, only that chapter did. Other chapters will flow as found in the two scriptures I referenced in the beginning. Hopefully, they will be present and staring into the strength of your soul.

Let me get personal with you about my current Holiday Battle. June 19, 2021, Our Pastor, Lonnie Johnson, of Growth Ministies, married my wife and I. August 5, 2021, three days before my oldest daughter's birthday, I got shot in the neck, inches away from being a fatal head shot. And because of my braids, tattoos, and criminal background, the officers at the hospital gave me the impression that I got what I deserved. And as these scriptures wrestled with my soul, I decided "the flight over the fight". Now I'm rebuilding my life, from scratch, many, many miles away from my family as I work on myself spiritually, mentally, physically, and financially, and placing my faith in God that He will continue to prevail.

I was in Lansing Correctional Facility when I wrote the business plan to SWAGG INC. More on SWAGG INC. later.

Just know that my business plan for SWAGG INC. saved my life.

Losing a family member to incarceration is like a death in the family. From over 30 years of impact, I can tell you that re-entry is like returning from the dead.



The system spit me out of prison for the last time in 2018. Homeless.

Moneyless. Geographically displaced.

On parole, with all the strings attached but with no home plan to help sever them.

My parole officer kept slippin' up; A/E after A/E or administrative error. I didn't know where to go. I was in survival mode--a familiar disposition. Foster care. Gang life. Prison. I thought I could survive anything.

But there I was on parole. No home plan. Sleeping in a car. It was the only time I ever thought about ending my life.

I gripped onto my plan for SWAGG INC.

Held onto it for dear life. The sentences scrawled across the pages lifted off the paper and grasped me back. They didn't let me go. My vision pulled me back from the edge.

Now, SWAGG is alive.

At SWAGG INC--Serve Witness And Give Guidance, Inspiration Never Ceases--we believe once you get out of prison, you should stay out.

We created a new business model to provide a solution to the re-entry/recidivism process.

It's all about *Pre-Entry Planning* here at SWAGG INC. That's all we do. It's who we are.

Les Miles said "It's winners and losers in the world, but it's also people who have not been taught to win; they haven't been taught, mentored and developed."

Through our HOPES program--Healing Ownership Planning Employment Sustainability--we work with clients 1 year prior to release and 1-3 years in the community to help our clients successfully discharge probation and parole.

We develop Returning Citizens through education, employment etiquette, and entrepreneurship.

We've created a suite of services to help our clients and their loved ones. All of these services are things I wish I had.

We work hard to elevate the statuses of people impacted by mass incarceration and those in a position to do something to interrupt the system.

I always believed that SWAGG would become real someday.

What do you have to hold onto? What will you make real someday? Reader, whether you're behind bars or beyond bars, hold onto that thing with care.

Next month, I'll be sending you a *Pre-Entry Plan* that you can fill out for yourself. Until then, **just hold on!**

What does it mean to love? To be loved? Love is not something easily defined. Common definitions don't do it justice. Love can mean different things to different people. The way I feel loved may not resonate with my neighbor, but the way I give love may relate to my family. Love is not as simple as it might appear.

I struggle with the meaning of love because I am re-evaluating how I feel loved and how I show love. I have discovered that many of my actions are a result of my wanting to feel loved. Some of the ways I have tried to feel loved are by eating food, buying material things, and accomplishing tasks.

Each is a temporary fix to an underlying problem. I don't want to seek love in earthly things. I want to accept God's love for me so I don't need earthly things. God loves me, but knowledge is not enough. I need to accept that love, to be changed. It seems so simple on the surface. I have the desire to be loved, as I'm sure everyone does, but I can't receive it. If you also struggle with this, let's explore that roadblock together.

Love is a verb. (Merriam-Webster): Love Definition & Meaning

- to hold dear
- to feel a lover's passion, devotion, or tenderness for
- to like or desire actively; take pleasure in
- to thrive in

Some examples of love as a verb include; I love burritos! I love you! I love shopping!

We only have one word for love, so we use it in all sorts of situations that don't call for it. Would we drop everything and drive eight hours for burritos? Probably not. (Those better be some GOOD burritos!)

That's the first problem; we only have one word to describe different sentiments and we use it to express every and any feeling. We use love to describe food, state our favorite activity, express how we feel towards our family, etc. As a result, we toss around the word love like it's a penny - it isn't worth much, and we have plenty to give out. Love as a verb is misused, abused, and overused.

What are the different loves? In C.S. Lewis's book, *The Four Loves*, he breaks down love into four different categories: storge, philia, eros, and agape. Storge is the love of a mother and child, old friends, and comfortable situations. Philia is the love of companionship, kinship, and friendship. Eros is the love of a romantic relationship and marriage. Agape is the love that God has for his children, unconditional and unfailing. Four Types of Love - Official Site | CSLewis.com

Unfortunately, he doesn't have a category for the love of burritos, but we can forgive him for that! The affectionate, storge love I have for my family is different from the eros, romantic love I have for my husband, which is different from the philia, friendship love I have for my neighbor. All three are practice loves for charity, agape love shown to us by Jesus Christ.

Lewis didn't make a category for burritos, because love is relational. All categories of love are for describing relationships. That doesn't include food, because we don't have a relationship with burritos. Love doesn't pertain to objects or activities. The Merriam-Webster dictionary's definition of love is incorrect. We shouldn't use it to describe burritos or shopping.

The second problem is we treat the verb love as a state of being, but it is also an action. For example, my actions towards my husband are different from those towards my family. I express eros love differently than philia love. I love both parties but show it in different ways.

I love my husband by sharing or pooling our resources. We live in the same house and have a joint bank account, but we also combine our gifts to further God's kingdom. Our day-to-day life reflects our values. We go to church and take time to attend a Bible study together. Because we love each other, we build each other up and help each other grow in faith.

I love my parents, but my actions towards them are different. I don't have a shared bank account with them. We don't go to the same church, Bible study, or live in the same house, but I still love my parents. I love my parents by keeping them updated on my life (at minimum). We speak weekly, at least. My husband and I make a point of spending time with them because we love them. If they needed me, I would drop everything and drive eight hours to help my parents.

Actions speak louder than words. If you truly love someone, it will be expressed in your actions.

The third problem with love today is we ignore the teaching and rebuking part of love. Love is pointing out sin. How often do we hide the truth from someone because we don't want to hurt their feelings? How often do we lie to someone to save them from pain or small inconveniences? That is NOT love.

The Bible is full of examples of Jesus and his disciples speaking the truth, no matter how convicting it was. Luke 9:55 says, "But Jesus turned and rebuked them." Paul corrects Peter in the letter to the Galatians. Galatians 2:14 says, "When I saw that they were not acting in line with the truth of the gospel, I said to Peter in front of them all, 'You are a Jew, yet you live like a Gentile and not like a Jew. How is it, then, that you force Gentiles to follow Jewish customs?'"

God considers the Biblical correct of his followers to be love. *Proverbs 27:5* says, "Better is open rebuke than hidden love." Love is pointing out sin; love is confronting evil; love is helping someone out of their sin.

My pastor recently said, "Jesus' love never compromises His truth." The love of God will never contradict His holiness. He loves us by not allowing us to continue living in sin, but to get us out of that sin, He has to challenge us.

James 1:2-4 says, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything."

Love is reserved for relationships. It is an action. Love includes telling the truth and confronting sin.

1 John 4:10 says, "This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

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My father died when he was only 56 years old. My mother was 53. She rarely had a job outside of the home and was lost when he was gone.

Money was very tight for Mama. As a result, she lived with us for three years until she was old enough to collect Daddy's Social Security. She felt like she was a burden on us because she could not contribute financially.

Often she would say, "I don't know why the Lord doesn't just take me, too. I just don't know why I'm still here."

Even though she couldn't contribute financially, she helped in many other ways.

Later Mama was able to move into a town home. During the time she lived there, she babysat several of her grandchildren. She was firm and yet did little things to make their time with her fun and memorable.

She took them for rides around the lake or to the store to get a treat. She joked, sang and taught them life lessons.

Mama picked my sister's son along with his friends up from school. They would beg her to take them by McDonald's. She would teasingly respond with, "Do you kids think I've taken you in to raise?" Then take them by McDonald's with the understanding they could have a hamburger or French fries, but not both.

They loved her.

When she passed, all her grandchildren – and children - felt a huge loss.

Mama had absolutely no idea of the impact she made with not only those grandchildren, but others whose lives she touched along the way.

Recently my grandson gave me a little book in which he wrote things he loved about me. Things like my smile, my kindness, my compassion and my humor. I was astounded! And very humbled. I had absolutely no idea he felt that way.

Your life has impact, also. Even though you may feel you are not in a position to make a difference, you do. Each thoughtful deed touches someone's life. Things you didn't think twice about doing or saying touched at least one person.

The biggest impact you can make is when you pray for someone. That can be life changing. You may think that is not much to do, but it is. You are reaching the spiritual realm.

Please do not feel your life is in vain and has no value. You do have value!

You may feel like you have no purpose in life, but you do. Sometimes it takes a while to realize what that is.

Can I tell you that it is the little things that matter most? The personal touches are the things people will remember most about you.

I know the holidays are very difficult for many of you. You may feel your life is meaningless and wish you could go back and change things. You might have many regrets. Your life is not over.

Even though you cannot go back and change things, you can decide to let your live have some meaning, regardless of where you are. Little things you say or do have a huge impact, especially to those you love.

Someone around you needs what you can offer. Your life has meaning and impact – even though you may be unaware of it. Don't ever feel that it doesn't.

There was a time in my life that I am not at all proud of. It was a time when I made a lot of stupid mistakes and bad decisions that cost me and the people close to me a lot of heartache. One time in particular, I was living with my mom (God rest her soul), she was the recipient of the sorrow of my craziness. I remember her coming into my room and sitting on the edge of my bed where I was lying and saying to me, "You are gutter trash to me". Making it to "Gutter Trash" status often starts with the way we think or the things we allow our mind to focus on. We allow ourselves to graduate over time thinking and meditating on things that are contrary to the will of God. Then one day, our minds are so corrupted and unclean, its like they are in a gutter. That is when we are ripe for the enemy to drag us into all kinds of ungodly situations.

As usual, God in His ultimate wisdom, has a Word that can get us back to where we need to be. *Philippians 4:8* gives us a list of things we can focus our attention on. You could spend a good deal of time unpacking each one. I will touch slightly on a couple of them.

The first thing it says we should meditate on or think about are things that are <u>true</u>. This makes me think about the Word of God. That is the purest source of "Truth" that I know. If we meditate on the scriptures and let them guide us through life, it is almost impossible to fail.

It also says to meditate on things that are <u>noble</u>. Being noble is about possessing fine personal qualities or high moral standards. It is about being elevated above ungodliness. Not allowing your mind to be stuck pondering on the lower things of life.
