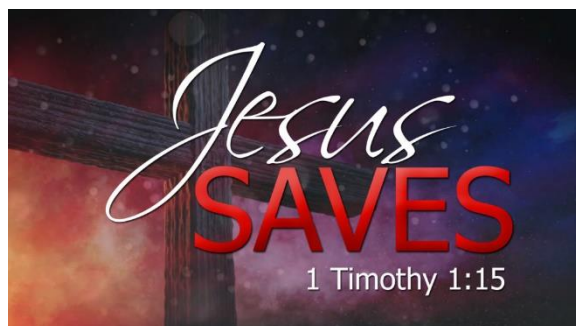
Several years ago, a close friend of our family went into the hospital for heart issues –he had an enlarged heart. While he was in the hospital, I felt the Lord lead me to go visit him and talk to him about the birth, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus for the forgiveness of our sins and how His finished work at the cross gives us righteous standing with God the Father. I felt a little awkward, and argued with the Lord that I wouldn't know what to say to him, but I cared about this man, and I wanted to obey the Lord, so I did. During that visit, I invited him to receive Christ as his Savior and he did so.

Several months later, he informed me that from that day he was delivered and free from drinking, drugs, cigarette smoking, and physically abusing his girlfriend. I knew the girlfriend and I knew this to be true. My family and I could visibly see the difference in this young man. He even had experienced healing in his physical heart. Five years later he was still free from all of those things.

A few years later I shared the same information with a young girl on our block. She had changed since I had seen her in grade school.... She wore black clothing and dark heavy makeup and would scream profanities up and down the street. When we visited she shared that she had lost her two best friends who had moved from the area, and that the only people who would befriend her in her new school were those who behaved and dressed like her. After sharing with her about Jesus and his love for her and his sacrifice at the cross for her, she accepted him as Savior and then she left. One week later she showed up at my door. She was so beautiful... her entire demeanor had changed. All of the dark make up was removed, she was dressed attractively, her hair was clean and combed, and I never saw her scream and curse in the neighborhood again after that.

Both of these friends were dramatically changed with the simple good news of the gospel of Grace and the love of God the Father and his Son, Jesus Christ.

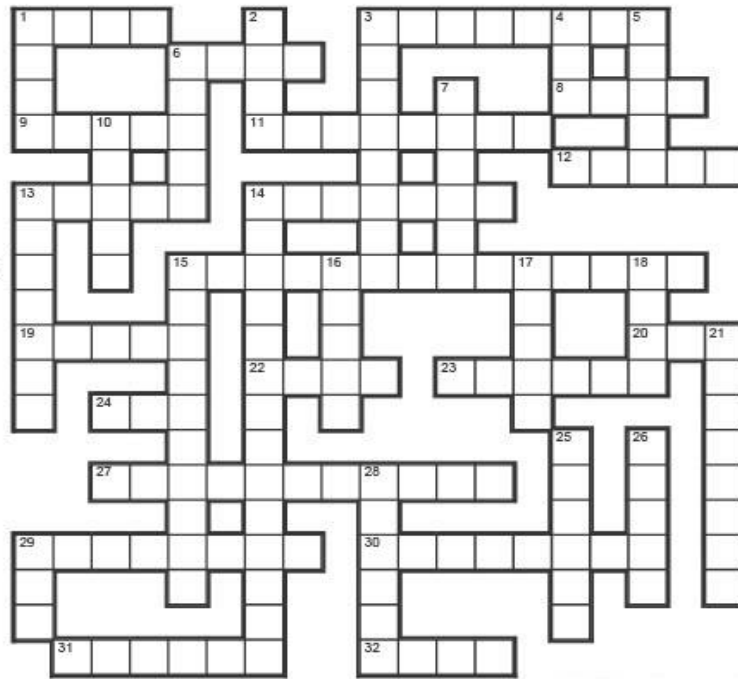

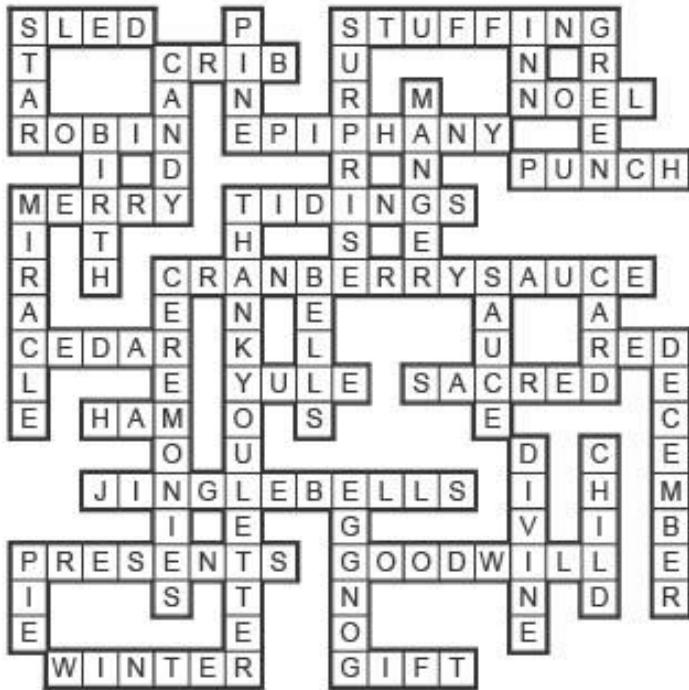

A person might be held captive by fear, anxiety, addictions, shame, debt... The list goes on. I think it's safe to say that every person is held in bondage in one form or another.

I personally have recognized that I have been in a self-imposed prison of deceit for years. For me that comes in the form of self-doubt and negative self-talk. One day I was telling myself "I don't have a voice, I have no influence, nobody would want to follow me, I have nothing to offer..." It dawned on me THAT is not the truth my Father who created me speaks of me. I asked myself, "Who IS saying this about me? Who have I been believing?" Immediately, I realized it was not the Father of Truth, but the father of lies. Not only have I been believing his lies, I have agreed with the lies, reinforcing them by speaking them to myself. These lies have kept my voice, my faith, and my identity in bondage, limiting God's fullness in me.

I wouldn't blame you for feeling my "prison" is small and insignificant compared to what you have been through. To be honest, I'm kind of embarrassed to bring it up, but just felt like I should for some reason. I hope it serves some purpose in your life.

I pray that this Christmas season be a time of freedom for you, a time that you courageously break out of any emotional or spiritual "prison cells" you have been locked up in. And that you can see yourself through the eyes of your creator. You are precious in his sight.

John 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

Song of Solomon 7:5 Your head crowns you like Carmel, And the flowing hair of your head is like purple threads; *The* king is captivated by *your* tresses (locks of hair).

That all means that GOD made you his own original masterpiece! He gave you your talents, your personality, your looks. You are uniquely made and loved by your creator, GOD!

The bible also says that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of GOD. What does that even mean? That means that we all need a Savior, JESUS! GOD gave his only son that we can be free from our bondage of sin. Short explanation is GOD sent his gift to us at Christmas, which is the reason for the season! It is truly the best GIFT ever.

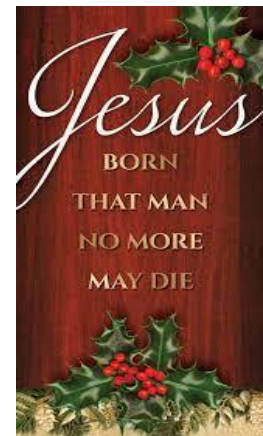

Several years ago, when I was young and deep in my mess, I was arrested for possession of a large amount of narcotics. I was able to get diversion when I went to court by saying that I had a drug problem and volunteer to admit myself to a residential drug and alcohol treatment center.

This was not my first time getting in trouble with the law, just not for drugs, and I actually did have a substance abuse problem. So, my family was pretty tired of me and sort of watched from afar.


Well, this happened to be around the holiday season. I was admitted somewhere around the beginning of fall. I made it through Thanksgiving without breaking down, but when Christmas started getting close, I started to feel “some kind of way” about being in this place and not being able to be with family. I would talk to my family and girlfriend (who is now my wife) on the phone and see them every now and then, but I still felt lonely. I remember the facility I was in had a Christmas dinner and we could invite family. I told my people about it, but no one showed up. I felt like they were done with me. I was not mad at them; I was mad at myself for being in this situation. So, I decided to accept that everybody was through fooling with me. Later that evening the doorbell rang. It was a group of people from a local church. They wanted to come in and spend Christmas evening with “the poor sinners”. We all gathered in our big meeting room. They shared the gospel with us, sang some Christmas songs, then handed us some wrapped gifts.

After they left, I went to my room and opened my gift. It was a three pack of socks. Not a lot to jump up and down about, right? Wrong! I cried. I instantly realized that even though I may not be at home with my family or celebrating with my girlfriend, God was there with me. I didn’t see that at first. But I did after he made it even more obvious by sending his Angels to comfort me. To guard my emotions and mental wellbeing. I cherished those socks more than any clothing I had.

No matter how far you are from loved ones, no matter how long it has been since you have felt their touch, God is holding you in His arms. God has sent Angels to comfort you. You may not have recognized them. Maybe it is someone in this magazine. Maybe after reading this you have realized you have Angels around you.

God is always with you. He is there now holding your hand. That’s his promise. ***Psalm 73:23 Nevertheless, I am continually with you; you hold my right hand.***

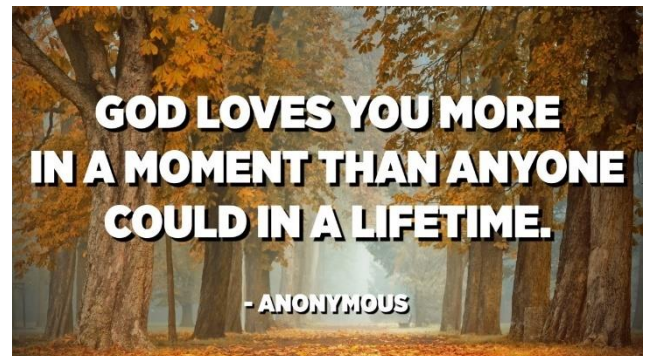
