

Flip Your Life Over This Time Out

"How goes it OG?"

"I'm making due, 'he said, "I'm just chillin' out."

After sitting on a bench for some time, I felt an urge to plant another seed into my friend's heart.

"OG, your dad gets out in two years, right?"

"Yup."

"That Oklahoma penitentiary he's in is a tough place to be. I understand you are getting out in a few months. Are you going to go visit him?"

"I plan on it. It's been a long time since I last seen him or talked to him. I have reservations because I want to flip my life over this time out. I want things to be different for me. But I'm not sure how much I want him to be a part of my life. When I was young, I harbored a lot of resentment towards him. I never wanted to be like him ~ a bad drunk and poor excuse for not being a dad, and family man. He never encouraged me to do the right things in the right way. I eventually became every bit of the street thug he was and much more."

So, I said, "There is a story recorded in the bible (2 Kings 24,25) about a young king named Jehoiachin that parallels your life. Jehoiachin descended from a long line of nefarious, idolatrous kings. All of them committed indescribable acts, sort of like you've experienced. Eventually Jehoiachin was thrusted into kingship himself. He had the golden opportunity to change his life, and the lives of the people who lived in the land of Judah. He understood his sinful lineage and experienced firsthand the consequences his family endured by disobeying God. But in spite of this, he followed the same path of rebellion, that of his father, believing he could somehow avoid God's disappointment and anger. He fell into the same immature, arrogant, and sinful patterns of his dad. Today you hear young people in society mimicking a similar belief: I got this! The premise is a self-righteous, and self-absorbed schema."

"God didn't create us to live life on our own, by our own intentions, or merits. He's the reason we are and live. Jehoiachin pursued status rather than the godly character to lead. He wanted to be feared rather than respected. And guess what always happens when this false sense of security meets its mirror in life? In three short months the enemy emerged with its eye on the young king. Just when he thought he had everything under control, Babylon invaded, conquered, and stripped him of everything he loved and cared about. It must have felt unfair to him but the enemy in life shows no mercy. More importantly, God will not tolerate continuous rebellion. Even though His love, grace, and forgiveness is readily available, He will let you choose to have your own way; regardless of where it may lead. Jehoiachin's way led him to prison."

Flip Your Life Over This Time Out ... cont.

"After 37 years in prison a new king arrived. He decided to set the prisoners free. It wasn't because they deserved it by completing programs or earning time off for good behavior, but only because he wanted to. The new king wanted to make things right. Jehoiachin was granted his freedom. He traded in his old prison jumpsuit and trusted in this king for a place of position in the new king's palace."

"God never gave up on the young imprisoned Jehoiachin. He was merciful to him. The Good News is that He will be merciful and loving to you OG regardless of your circumstances and no matter where your rebellious life has taken you. The bible has this to say,

'For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through Him.' (John 3:16-17). Amen."

"John goes on to record Jesus saying, '... I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.' (10:10).

He promises to give you a new heart with a purpose for a new journey." (Ezekiel 36:26-27)

"I know you grew up in a tough environment with a splintered family atmosphere, quit school at age fifteen, and embraced the streets. You have spent the better part of your life in prison. Life may look bleak, but you still have opportunities to live life in the right ways. It's the ripe time for you to put God's word into play instead of what the world says about you."

"Consider this ... You ought to go see your dad, love and forgive him, support him as best you can."

when he will wipe the tears from my eyes.


The dove so gentle, so sweet He calls to me come celebrate the Raven's defeat.

People Praying Or Preying for Me

Prayer for me is demonstrating the Principles of God through our vessels as a human being created for Divine purpose. It's God's True Idea.

"Preying" to me is demonstratively enforced, it relegates the Spirit of Christ's Omnipotence to boundaries or limitations, and it's usually denominationally specific, and separates God's Children, versus being fair or impartial...

That TV had every appliance in the house in it, a Stereo Radio, an 8-Track Deck, an Album Player & a very handy piece of accessory called a pair of vice grips ha, ha, ha; you'd use them to turn the channel knob on the TV to the tune of a rhythmic clicking sound, then the pictures appear, and a child becomes "Pure", that's "Prayer" to me, true and innocent desires without the World's ignorance or bias that prevent Spiritual potential, or cause miseducation.

(Before Prison) Prayer to me will always be the beauty that God shows in the Honest desires of His Children.

My incarceration has been an invaluable Christ like education in learning the distinct differences between Praying And Preying.

For some people pray, and some others prey, and prisons are a breeding ground for manipulation. They claim to be Christian, but separate God's Divine Words and Spiritual World into different entities. But there is only One Word of God, there is only One World of God's, and it's all Divine, and it's all shown thru' Universal truth in nature, which is natural to God's Children! So, for the complete "Salvation" of All His Children, the One and Only God gave "US" Glory through the likeness of Christ.

I AM built to fall, yet "I AM" will never fail. I AM perfect with Flaws from fighting to keep my Sacred birth rite as God's child. I had to know and discover this fact thru' identifying w\ Moses's "Being", His "Being" guilty by Pharaoh to a fault, then Christ Jesus' "Being" honest to a fault. Seasons

Just as there are seasons in nature, there are also seasons in our individual lives. It would be foolish to think we could just skip winter and live in a perpetual springtime... the earth would have to change its tilt and stop its orbit around the sun.

In the same way, there are times in our lives we would prefer to skip, or erase, but that cannot be. Those difficult, winter seasons of life help us become all we have the potential to become.



I have found there are 2 keys to help me navigate difficult or challenging situations. These keys are:

- 1. Responsibility and
- 2. Surrender.

These keys work together, like two pedals on a bike, to move me through as quickly and with as little trauma as possible.

The first key is Responsibility. Each individual person is responsible for their own Thoughts, Feelings, and Actions. No one is ever responsible for another person's thoughts, feelings, or actions. Just getting clear on what IS and IS NOT, my responsibility clears up a lot of chaos. Stop trying to fix other people. Stop trying to please other people. Instead, take radical responsibility for yourself. Each day, live a life you are proud of. This alone will create a type of momentum which makes you feel better, even if your circumstances do not change.

The other key is Surrender. We are affected by so many things over which we have absolutely zero control, things for which we are not responsible. The best way to handle the chaos of these things is to surrender. Release your frustrating attempts to influence and change things that you aren't responsible for.

Surrender isn't just throwing your hands up and walking away. It isn't "Whatever!" with a shake of the head and a frown. Surrender is GIVING circumstances (and people) UP.... Placing them in God's hands. Letting go of your attempts to control, instead allowing GOD to take over. You still care, and may even be able to influence. But you have released that pressure of trying to change things you cannot change.

When you surrender, your heart can soften through the chaos and difficulty. Your heart can come to rest upon a bedrock of God's unconditional love. In letting go, you discover that you are being held, that you always have been held.

My favorite Bible story when I am in a difficult season of life is Joseph beginning in Genesis 37. His brothers were going to murder him but decided to sell him as a slave instead. Joseph made the best of his life as a slave, and his owner trusted him fully. Then Joseph's master's wife decided she wanted to sleep with him and tried to seduce him. Joseph refused, but instead of anyone rewarding him for his moral compass, he was falsely accused of rape and thrown into prison. Again, Joseph made the best of his life as a prisoner. Eventually, God made a way for him, he was released from prison and promoted to Prime Minister (talk about a rags to riches story!).

Years later when he saw his brothers again, they were groveling, scared for their own lives now that Joseph had power over them. But Joseph didn't even want that conversation with them. He said, "You meant it for evil, but God meant it for good." The end.

At some point in your difficulty, it is possible for you to come to terms with everything, just as Joseph did. Perhaps it wasn't brothers who betrayed you, perhaps you betrayed yourself. But when you surrender to God, He will literally cause all of it to work together for your good.

And in the meantime, you too, like Joseph, can make the best of your situation by taking radical responsibility for your own thoughts, feelings, and actions.



What Does God Want From Us?

Micah 6:8 (Part One) Doing Justice

"He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God." Micah 6:8

Micah ("Who is like God?") was a prophet during the late southern kingdom of Judah and the fall of the northern kingdom of Israel, under these kings of Judah—Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah —around 700 B.C.



One of the most popular and famous verses among both Jews and Christians encouraging social justice is Micah 6:8. Most believers have the desire to know more about what this verse teaches on the issues of justice, mercy, and humility. As we let the truth of this verse sink into our hearts, we will understand and appreciate this is no halfhearted command.

Micah 6 involves a hypothetical but critical conversation between the Lord and Israel. The Lord presents His case against His disobedient people. Israel's response was a series of questions beginning with, "With what shall I come to the Lord and bow myself before God on high?"

Israel launches into a succession of questions focusing on their external religious rites.

First, they ask if God would be satisfied "with burnt offerings of year-old calves?"

Second, they ask if they should bring "thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil."

Third, they ask whether they should offer their "firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"

This is not the answer. The answer is not a religious activity.

But God's answer to their questions is rooted in something they already know and understand, the Law of Moses: "He has told you, O man, what is good." God then says He did not need or desire their religious rites, sacrifices, or offerings. Instead, the Lord sought Israel's justice, mercy, and humility.

God is trying to tell them that the answer is much more profound than any religious talk or rituals: The sacrifice of the heart is what God demands. In this first article, we will investigate the first requirement of God for Israel and us today.

Do Justice

"To do justice" would have been understood by Israel and us as living with a sense of right and wrong, to give to everyone what is their due, to be equal to all, and oppress no one, in body, resources, or name; and to walk responsibly before God, and defend the needs of the innocent. "So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law of the Prophets." (Matthew 7:12). We must know and seek the Justice and righteousness of God in our lives. Throughout God's word, we see constant reminders that He is a just God. Justice is a foundational truth of His character and nature.

What Does God Want From Us? cont.

When we hear the word 'Justice,' many think of our justice system: good guys, bad guys, crime, and punishment.

Justice is a foundational, fundamental doctrine of the Christian life. We see justice throughout the words and works of Jesus, yet it is difficult to find in today's cultures, values, principles, and beliefs. To do justice for people is more than just a political, judicial, and economic problem. As everything and everyone around us seems to become more and more contentious, it is just more reason to work harder on moving from only talking about these things to faithfully living them out. As Christians, we should be known as a people of justice.

What Does it Mean to Do Justice?

To do justice means knowing and seeking God's justice and righteousness in our lives and the world around us. It is important to note that we are "to do justice!" It is not just a mere thought but something we must act upon; living out justice goes beyond mere words. And it is also not something we can only require of others. True justice is done in love with mercy, grace, humility, and a desire to honor and glorify God Almighty.

Our God is a God of justice. But God does things differently. We must not confuse His justice with our own.

If it were up to us, justice would be simple punishment. If someone breaks a moral law, they should be punished with jail or death.

Thank God His justice is not punitive. God always gives hope. If it were simply corrective or vindictive, He never would have sent Jesus. But punishment is not God's goal. His goal is reconciliation, and His purpose is redemption. God's justice is His plan and promise to reconcile all things to the way they were intended to be.

Jesus Christ is our ultimate example. Knowing that divine justice demanded payment for mankind's sin, and though Jesus Himself never sinned, He went to the Cross to "do justly." Showing true justice is... when you have the opportunity to tell someone what Jesus Christ did by dying for them on the Cross; take it!

"Every way of a man is right in his own eyes, but the Lord weighs the heart. To do righteousness and justice is more acceptable to the Lord than sacrifice." Proverbs 21:2-3


